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New mobile app technology to connect with on and off-reserve members

he leadership and Administration of M'Chigeeng First Nation takes pride in being forward-focused and always looking for ways to enhance our communications and utilizing technologies that can serve MFN community. In pursuit of these progressive values, M'Chigeeng First Nation has partnered with Communikit by Aivia Inc. to release a communications app for M'Chigeeng First Nation.

The official M'Chigeeng First Nation app allows band members to register directly and start receiving push notifications from the band office immediately. Users can access news articles, event postings, job opportunities, forms, PDF resources, and even local emergency alerts. Band members can even reach directly out to the band office with questions and feedback using the built-in contact forms.

"Making services and information accessible to our members is of utmost importance — not everyone has social media, not everyone lives on-reserve, and not everyone is going to think to check a website regularly — but nearly everyone has a smartphone and will now have real time access to information as it becomes available. I am very pleased that the Council of M'Chigeeng fully supports this initiative" explained Ogimaa Kwe (Chief) Linda Debassige.



Current Projects

Solid Waste Study- The project team is working with ISC on funding for the permanent transfer station, this station will be located at the Old Dump site, other actives for this project is plans for clean up of the garbage that was dumped over the escarpment. The Team is optimistic that we can have plans in place this fall with full funding from ISC.

Gaaming Lagoon- This project is in the final stages of the design, comments from ISC, Oceans and Fishers have been submitted for review. The project team is optimistic that the project can go to tender later this summer with completion scheduled for 2023.

Lakeview Booster Station- The remediation for this facility well underway, the project is approximately 90% completed, the team is addressing deficiencies and waiting for the permanent generator for the station.

Capital Projects/Public Works

CPPW office is reviewing the Roads Needs Study proposal from First Nation Engineering Services Ltd. The purpose of this Road Needs Study is to provide an overview of the overall condition of the M'Chigeeng's road system. The study will provide a rating of the general condition of the road system, by road section, including structural adequacy, drainage, and surface condition, as well as providing some indication of what appears to be deficient horizontal

and vertical alignment elements. The study information will provide direction to the staff as to what is required for road maintenance/improvement planning and budgeting. Traffic count ranges will be assumed to address the rapidly deteriorating roads, before the hard-top can be replaced, ditching must be completed & culverts needs to be replaced, some areas require the road to be rebuilt as the subsurface is compromised. This all requires planning and budgeting.

Lakeview School- Approval from leadership and ISC for the team to address immediate Health & safety items for the school, one of the main item's members will notice is a new hip style roof over the gym. This roof will eliminate the threat of snow loads on the existing timber framing and reduce the risk of water damage. See attached rendering from 3rd Line Studio.

Crosshill Watermain- The project team has been meeting regularly to ensure the scope of the project is clear, the design is 90% completed and will be ready for tender this fall, funding for this project is in the process.

Other projects we are working on is updating the Capital Planning Study, Elevated Storage Reservoir (Water tower) remediation.

all 2020 it was recognized the Capital Project Public Works Department was undersized, a review of the program & MFN's assets determined what is required to serve the community better and staffing that is required. A Gap Analysis Report was submitted in March 2021, identifying approximately 11.5 million required to address H&S issues, Restoration of Utilities, Asset Deterioration, Operational Items & Code Compliance issues. Many of these costs are needed to be done within the next 2 to 7 years. Some of the items are already being addressed (LV School, Gaaming Lagoon, LV Booster Station & E.S.R. aka water tower, new fire tuck & water truck). The gap analyst reports that could take approximately 5 years to get caught up on the items listed above. The reports recommends that a detailed building assessment be conducted (arena/complex issue), General Management policies set up with a Level of Service Standards, priority ranking for O&M backlog, creation of asset management department & training for managers on risk assessment management. As a result of the restructuring report the CPPW program was able to hire a full time housing manager and full time public works manager, these positions will respectively start a more detailed planning of programs and develop a long & short term strategy at getting our assets in top form and start planning for replacement & upgrades.

Congratulations to Treena Debassige, she is the successful candidate for the Public Works Manager position, and to Darcie Anderson was successful in landing the Housing Manager position, both women have experience in their respective fields that will benefit the programs.
