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anii Citizens of M'Chigeeng, just a follow-up since becoming the New Fire Chief for M'Chigeeng Fire Department, it has

been going very well, a little bit of a learning curve being on the administrative side but am a quick learner. This past year was the busiest for Fire calls for M'Chigeeng F.D. with a total of 29 calls. Since the new position, 40 homes in M'Chigeeng have been installed with Smoke/Carbon Detectors, and many more to come.

Our 1st Fire Prevention Week went very well, with 150+ students being educated in Fire Prevention. I also attended the Indigenous Public Safety Training/Conference back in September and that has been paying off with the networking connections made with Indigenous Service Canada and other Fire agencies in obtaining funds, ideas and successful training. We've been working with ISC on getting a new state of the art "Fire Station", our assessment has been approved and funded by ISC and is now in the planning stages, even reached out to Lafarge Canada in donating concrete for the build to help save costs and they agreed to work with M'Chigeeng.

The goal of the Fire Chief is getting a Fulltime First Response Unit, this will help create more full-time jobs within the community and serve as an important service for M'Chigeeng. Miigwetch for your time in reading this, Take Care and Stay Safe.

The First Nations Regional Health Survey (RHS) is the first—and only—national health survey created, conducted, and carried out by First Nations people for First Nations people.

Now in it's fourth phase, results from the RHS have been used to support policy and programming at the community, regional, and national level.

Rooted in Traditional and western understandings of health and well-being, the RHS gathers information from First Nations people living on reserve and in Northern First Nations communities.

The RHS is carried out by the First Nations Information Governance Centre (FNIGC), a non-profit First Nations organization that has been doing surveys on reserve and in Northern First Nations communities in collaboration with its Regional Partners since 1997.
